Respiratory Risk	Transmission of COVID-19 during sessions via aerial transmission	Potential transmission of COVID-19	<p>During the sessions, coaches will maintain social distancing between participants</p> <p>Drills will be designed to maintain social distancing with clearly defined areas for each participant to stand</p> <p>PTO There are no upper limits to the size of groups but sessions will be split into groups to minimize the numbers in each group</p> <p>Each group is spaced out throughout the field to ensure that participants will minimise contact with others</p> <p>The club has decided that 1 group in each of 4 corners of the field will provide more than enough separation between groups</p> <p>Once groups have been chosen then participants will not move between groups during sessions to ensure that contact is kept to a minimum</p> <p>Participants have been asked to not turn up too early for start time and if they do, stay in their vehicles until sessions start</p> <p>During the sessions, parents have been asked to stay in their vehicles to avoid contact with other households</p>
