Patrons will not be allowed to move in between groups.</p> <p>Outdoor seating will be provided at tables with 4 seats with more seating allowed if social distancing rules can be maintained</p> <p>Patrons should remain seated when ordering, being served and consuming food and drink</p> <p>Patrons should wear a face covering when entering the room to be seated and when using the toilet facilities. Face coverings are not necessary when seated at the allotted table</p>
